Baldernock Community Council – This statutory body has been able to liaise closely with EDC over a number of issues as well as maintaining contact with our local counsellors. We continue to represent views on planning applications (the Synetiq site and Dougalston) The Local Polling Station under threat of closure has been secured, and access to the church hall under consideration. Our grant has been used to support local projects including Baldernock Primary School and the updating of the website as well as the Local Tartan initiative. Broadband provision remains a key issue and with the BCDT we continue to look to major improvements. See below for further details.
